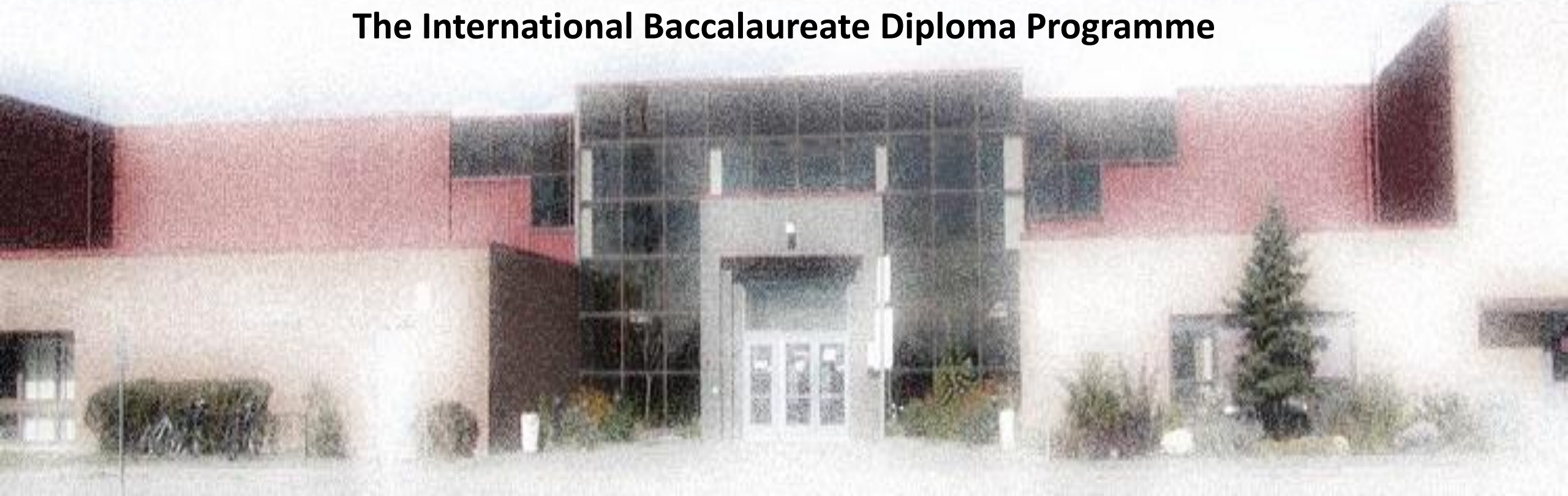

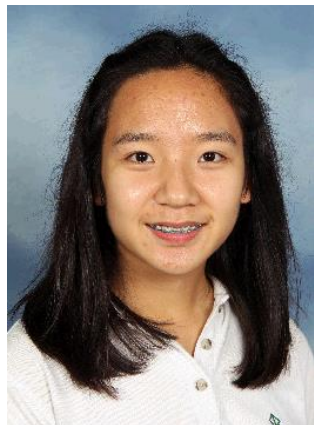

IB: An Education for Life



- Founded in 1968 for internationally mobile students
- Focus on Whole Person
- International Perspective
- Responsible citizenship
- Critical and compassionate thinkers
- Informed participants in local and international affairs
- Respectful of other cultures and attitudes



What are the **similarities** between the International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Programmes?

- Both have a rigorous course load.
- Both are enhancement/enrichment programs to the Ontario Curriculum
- Both teach courses at a first year University level which may be eligible for University credits.



What are the **differences** between the International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Programmes?

- AP courses are stand alone courses that students choose to take, whereas in IB, students follow a diploma program with set required courses.
- In AP students can choose one area of focus, whereas in IB, students receive a well-rounded curriculum.
- AP grades are solely determined by exams written in May, whereas IB grades are determined by both external and internal assessments, usually 80% external and 20% internal.

- B+ average minimum



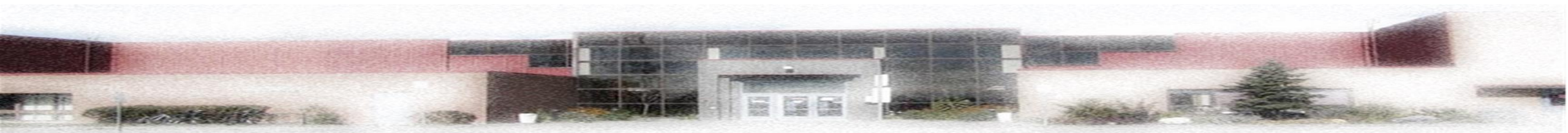
What are the benefits of becoming an IB student?

- Recognized by universities as an excellent preparation for success at the university level
- Internationally recognized and prevalent throughout Canada
- Students are grouped for scheduling purposes to develop a strong academic culture.
- Students associate with like-minded individuals.
- Students are taught by IB trained teachers.
- Students receive a rigorous program through the IB curriculum which enhances the Ontario curriculum.
- The St. Robert Pre-IB program is designed to gradually introduce the knowledge and skill that will ready students for the IB program in grade 11

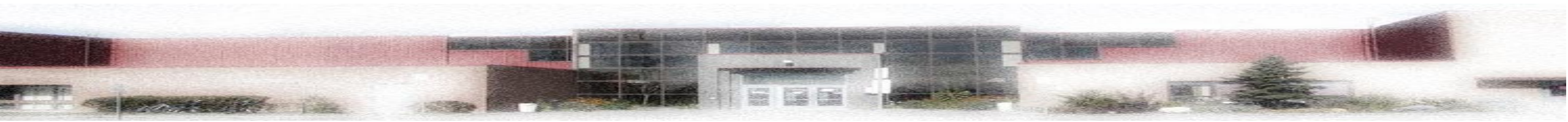

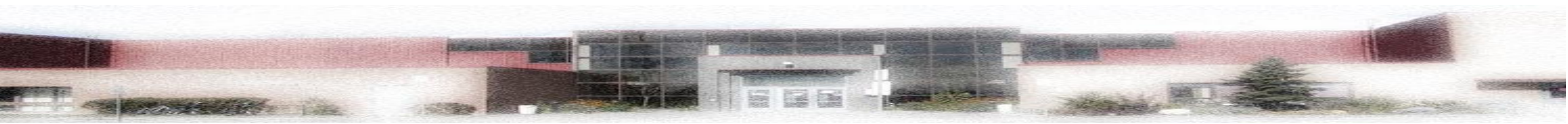

- Performance is based on a 7 point scale for each course.

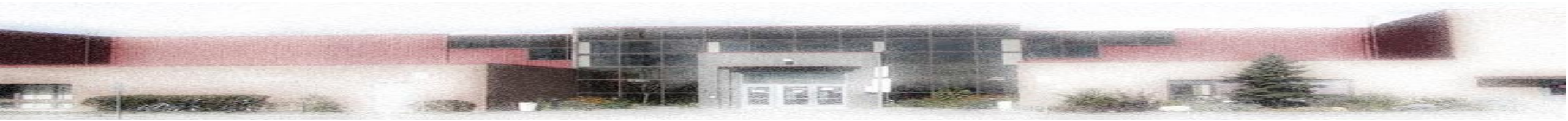
➤ 6 Course x 7 points/course = 42 points

Bonus points for outstanding

Extended Essay & TOK Essay = 3 points

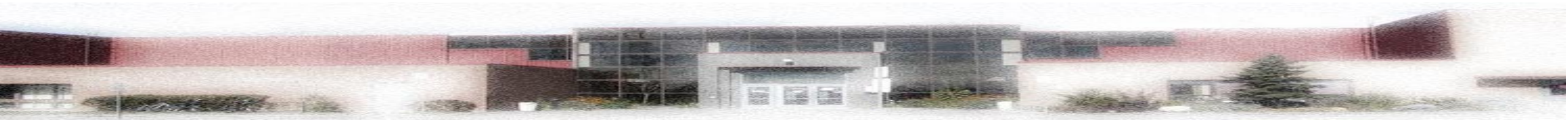
TOTAL: = 45 points

Minimum score needed for the IB Diploma is 24 points

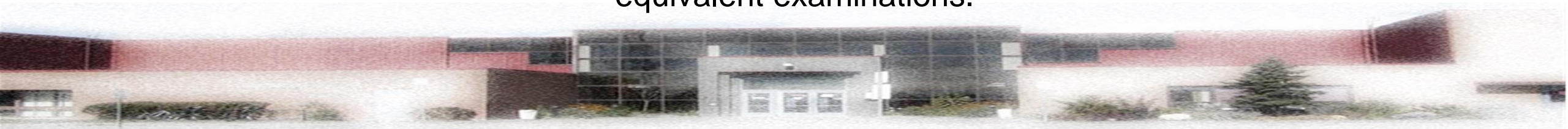

- **Step 1: By 3:00 PM on Wednesday, November 14th** – sign up for the Entrance Exam will close.
- **Step 2: On Saturday, November 17th** – Bring \$60 cheque or cash (no change will be provided, please bring exact amount) to registration desk prior to test
- Students, please bring a calculator and a pencil
- NOTIFICATION – By Mail (January)

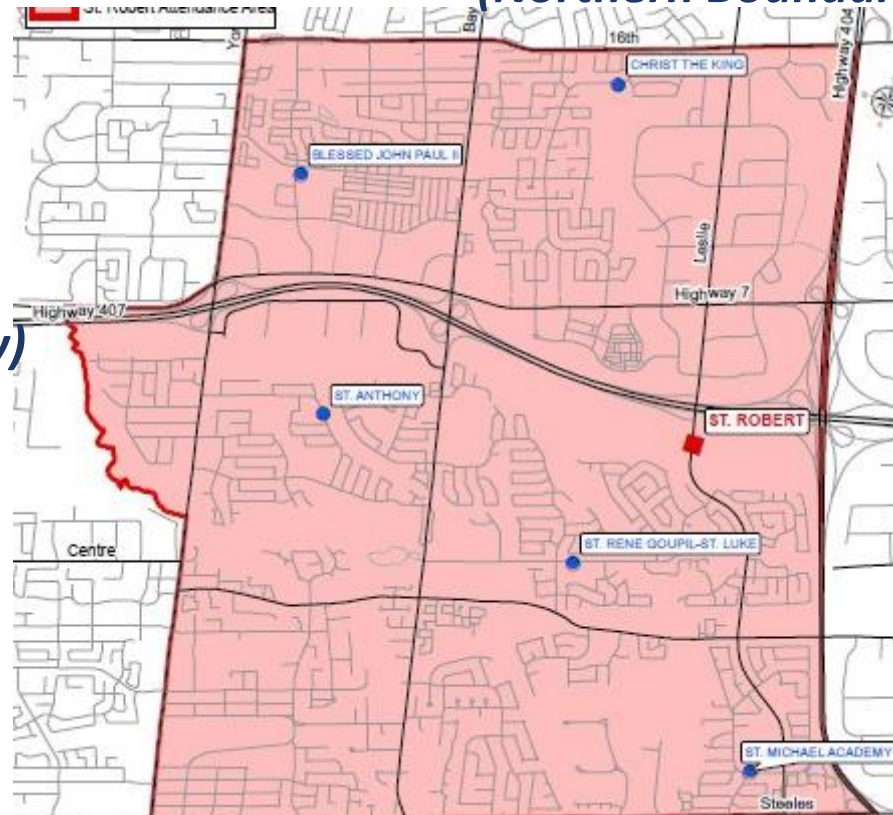


School Boundaries



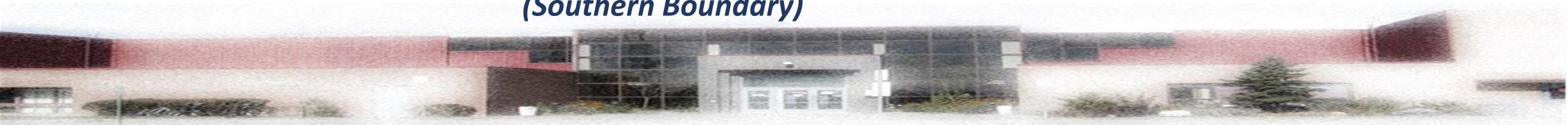
South of 16th Avenue

School Attendance Area - Town of Aurora

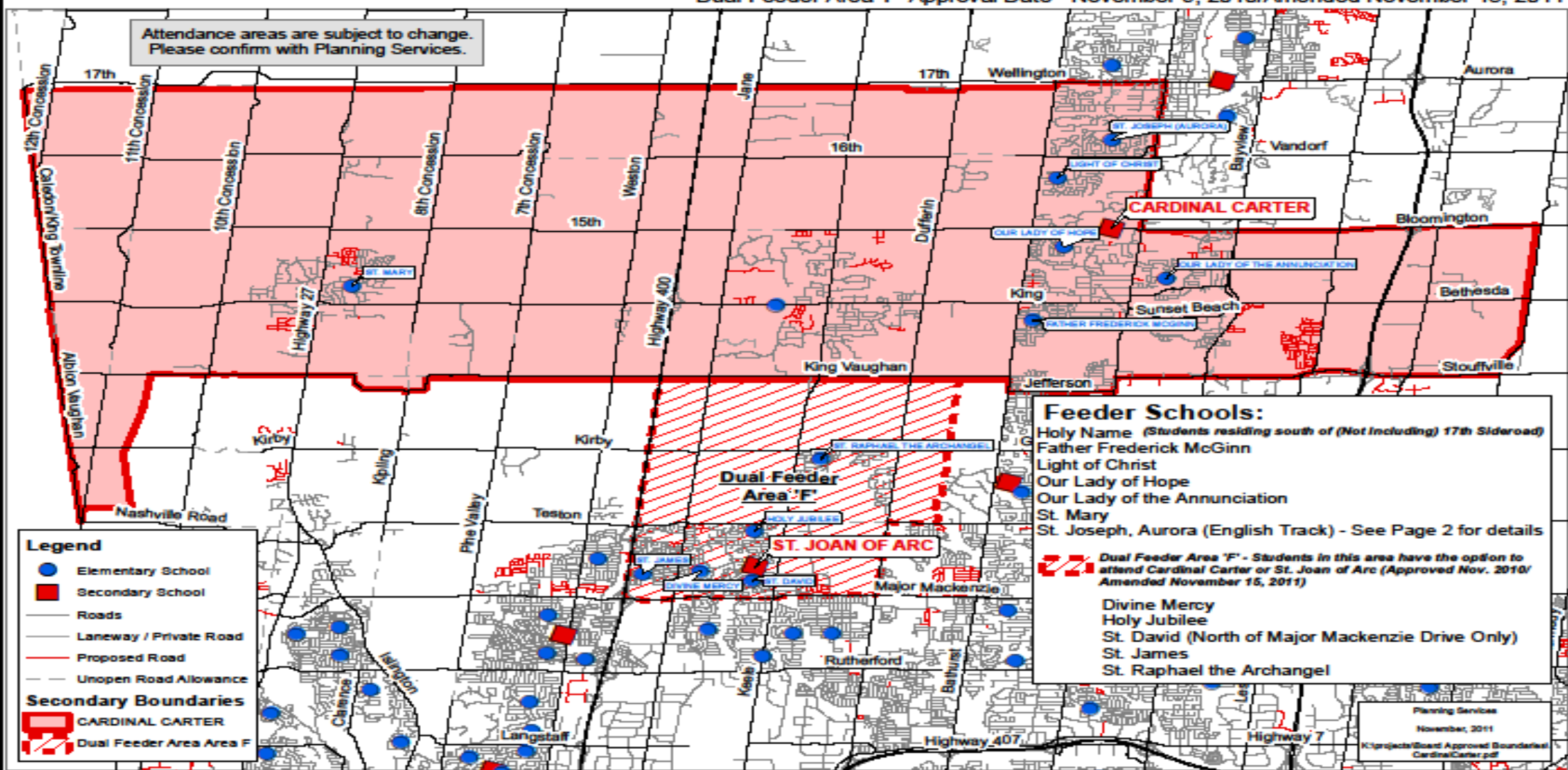

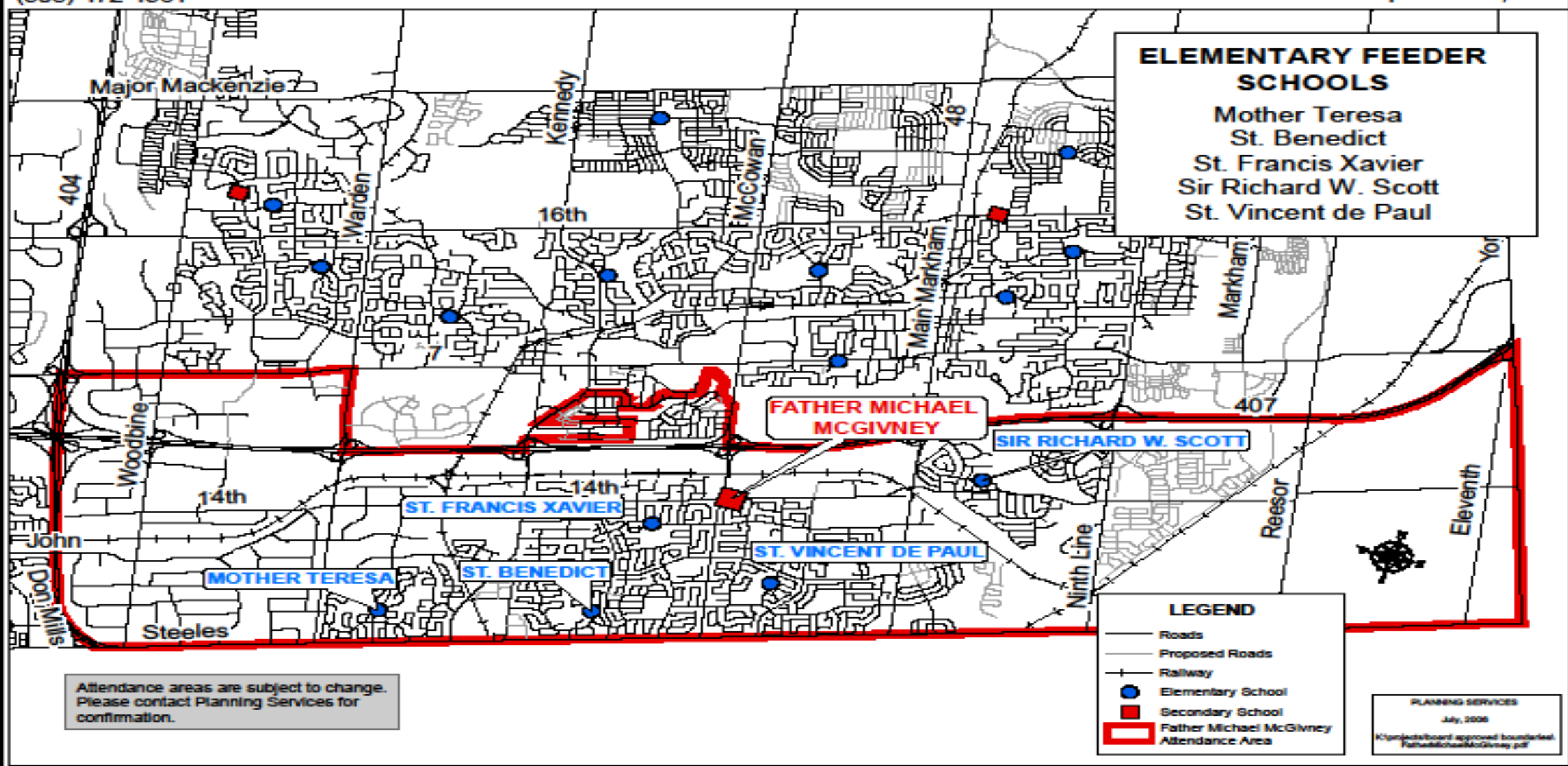

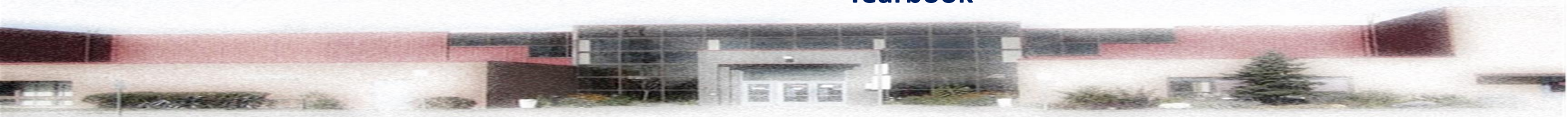
